	<p>Stanzas - A Stanza is a set amount of lines grouped by rhythmical pattern and meter. Stanzas are used in poetry for structure. The length and pattern of the stanza decides what type of poem it is.</p>	<p>Meter - Meter is a unit of rhythm in poetry, the pattern of the beats. It is also called a foot. Each foot has a certain number of syllables in it, usually two or three syllables. The difference in types of meter is which syllables are accented and which are not.</p>	<p>Rhyme - A rhyme is a repetition of similar sounds (or the same sound) in two or more words, most often in the final syllables of lines in poems</p>
